



What to expect at the polls

- Show your ID to a poll worker.
- The poll worker will check you in.
- They will hand you a blank ballot.
- Put the ballot in a voting machine and make your choices.
- Check if your ballot is correct.
- Feed it into the machine that counts ballots.
- Get your “I Voted!” sticker!

If you forget your ID or you aren’t on the list of registered voters, you can still vote using a provisional ballot.

Who to call if your rights have been violated

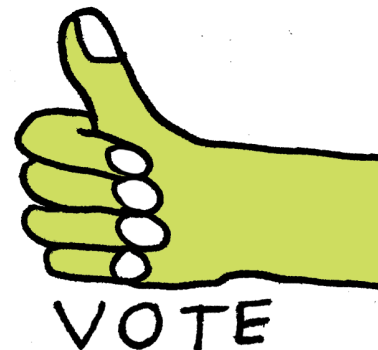
- Aggressively questions you about your citizenship, criminal record or other qualifications to vote.
 - Falsely presents themselves as an election official.
 - Threatens you, harasses you or interferes with your choice of candidates.
- For example, if someone:**
- Threatens you, harasses you or interferes with your choice of candidates.
- What is voter intimidation?**
 Voter intimidation is a violation of your civil rights and a federal crime.

You have the right to...

- Vote privately and independently.
- Vote in an ADA-compliant vote center.
- Ask for assistance to vote, if you are disabled or if you can’t read or write English. You must request help before you go into a voting booth.
- Vote if you have a criminal record.

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What do all these politicians do?

Governor

The state's top official can veto or sign bills into law. They're also in charge of the state military.

Lieutenant governor

- Serves as president of the state Senate and can give tie-breaking votes on bills.
- Oversees many state agencies.
- Takes over as governor if the governor dies, resigns or is removed from office.

The attorney general's office

- Defends state officials and agencies in lawsuits.
- Protects consumers from fraud and unfair business practices.
- Gives opinions on whether laws align with the state constitution.

State House representative/senator

They write bills, which are drafts of possible laws. They vote on whether these bills will be sent to the governor, who can sign them into law.

Township board of trustees

They oversee the township trustee and approve budgets, which the trustee's office uses to help residents with rent, utility bills or other needs.

School board members

They influence school curriculum; hire and fire school superintendents; and approve budgets that affect staff, programs and school safety.

The Marion County treasurer's office

Collects taxes (like property taxes) and manages the county's financial resources.
