- Vote privately and independently.
- Vote in an ADA-compliant vote center.
- Vote if you have a criminal record.
- Ask for assistance to vote if you are disabled or if you can't read or write English. Request help before going into a voting booth.

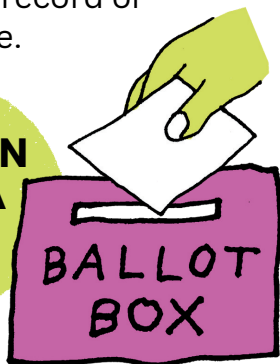
YOU HAVE THE RIGHT TO...

WHAT IS VOTER INTIMIDATION?

Voter intimidation is a violation of your civil rights and a federal crime.

It's voter intimidation if someone:

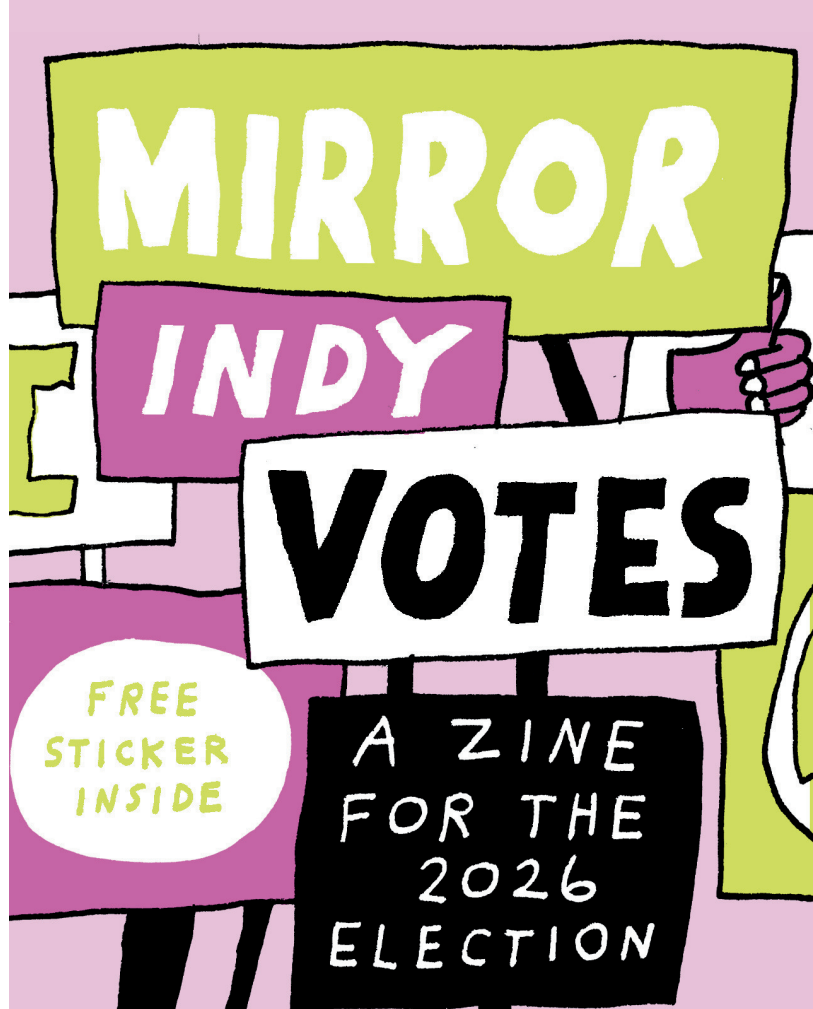
- Threatens you, harasses you or interferes with your choice of candidates.
- Falsely presents themselves as an election official.
- Aggressively questions you about your citizenship, criminal record or qualifications to vote.



If you forget your ID or you aren't on the list of registered voters, you can still vote using a provisional ballot.

- Show your ID to a poll worker.
- The poll worker will check you in.
- They will hand you a blank ballot.
- Put the ballot in a voting machine and make your choices.
- Check if your ballot is correct.
- Feed it into the machine that counts ballots.
- Get your "I Voted!" sticker!

WHO YOU'LL VOTE FOR

- ➔ **U.S. House representative**
They represent us at the federal level, advocating for the people in their district. Their duties include drafting and passing federal laws.
- ➔ **Statehouse representative and senator**
They represent us at the state level. They write and vote on bills, which are drafts of possible laws.
- ➔ **Sheriff**
They are law enforcement for Indianapolis and Marion County. The sheriff oversees the jail, serves criminal warrants, protects county government buildings and maintains the sex offender registry.
- ➔ **Township trustees**
Trustees run assistance programs to help residents with rent, utilities and more needs. They manage township-owned property and create the annual township budget.
- ➔ **Constables of Small Claims Court**
Constables are responsible for security in courts and serving official court orders to residents. Constables can make arrests and "keep the peace." They can hire deputies to help carry out their duties.
- ➔ **Clerk of Circuit Court**
The Marion County Clerk collects money related to court cases and serves as the record keeper for the Circuit Court. They also serve as the secretary for the Marion County Election Board.
- ➔ **Judges of Small Claims Court**
Judges make decisions about personal injury, property damage, landlord-tenant disputes and more civil issues. They only hear cases that involve \$10,000 or less.
